

Drawing the back room.

Objective: Draw a TV console (TABLE)

Supplies: A piece of paper watercolor paper 11 x 15, a ruler, pencil, eraser

Procedure:



This is a blown up part of the bottom right side of the room.

The TV table starts one tile back from the edge of the paper. It is two inches tall.

1. Draw a rectangle that is one tile wide and 2 inches tall.
2. Draw vanishing point lines from the two top corners of the rectangle.

3. Draw a vertical line for the end of the table –This will be on the fourth tile from the edge of the paper making the table three tiles long.

4. Draw a horizontal line for the end of the top of the table.



5. Firm in the lines. Erase the tiles that will be hidden by the table.

6. The front of the TV table is going to have three drawers, two cabinets and one shelf. Make a mark on the front vertical to divide the front of the table into $\frac{1}{3}$ and $\frac{2}{3}$ rds. Then draw an orthogonal line.



7. Using the tiles as a guide for placement, draw two vertical lines for the sections on the lower part of the TV table.

8. Draw doors for the two outside sections and put door handles on.

9. For the shelf – draw a horizontal line to show that the shelf goes in.

10. Use verticals and orthogonal lines to create the drawers.

Keep going for the flat screen TV.



Flat screen TV :

1. Draw a thin rectangle no larger than three inches tall. It should sit on the table top against the wall.
2. Add the orthogonal lines for the top and bottom of the TV.
3. Add a vertical to cut the TV off at the correct size – so that it fits on the Table.
4. Firm in the lines.

The TV and TV table are done.
