

Watercolor supplies

Watercolor paper

Watercolor paints- liquid or dry

Brushers (flats and rounds)

Paper towels

Container for water

Salt, masking tape, rubber cement, plastic wrap, white color crayon, rubbing alcohol, toothbrush, eraser, sponge, watercolor pencils, straw

Watercolor board:

watercolor paintings should be taped down onto a board so that the paper stays flat. I use foam core board from hobby lobby or Michaels. You want the foam core cut so that it is a little bigger than the paper - ours at school is 20 x 15 . This is optional, but it is much nicer to paint on a flat surface than a buckled paper.

If the extra items can't be used in the home or school setting, that is ok and will not count against the grade. I present this so for the knowledge. Students just need to do the best they can.
